Page 80. March 5, 1764. John McCurry to Jacob Kent and Walter Crockett of Bedford County. Power of Attorney. Witnesses: John Talbot, John Brancer, Hugh Crockett, Margaret Crockett.

Page 81. March 8, 1770. Jacob Kent and Walter Crockett to Thomas Evans. 100 acres of land on the waters of the North Fork of Roanoke River, at a place called Devils Den. Witnesses: Samuel Crockett, Hugh Crockett.

Page 82. March 1, 1770. Paul Garrison, John Clark, Lydia Clark and Elizabeth Steel to William Preston. 137 acres in the County of Augusta near Botetourt on the waters of the Catawba. Witnesses: John May, Martin Baker, John Wilson.

Page 83. March 5, 1770. Solomon Litton to William Carvin. 12 pounds. Personal property. Witnesses: William Christian, Daniel McNeil.

Page 83. February 7, 1770. Valentine Linn and Charonoe Linn of Craven County, South Carolina to Davis Robinson. Power of attorney to convey to William Ingles 400 acres of land on the west side of Wood River, otherwise known as Roanoke River. Witnesses: John Bowyer, Robert Elliott.

Page 84. February 10, 1770. Matthew Arbuckle to Daniel Evans. 20 pounds. Personal property.

Page 84. February 10, 1770. Joshua McCormack to William Christian. personal property.

Page 84. March 14, 1770. John Wiley to Rachel Gamble. 20 pounds. 260 acres on a branch of Looneys Mill Creek.

Page 86. John Heavin, Sr. and Sarah Heavin to their sons Howard and John Heavin. For a valuable consideration. 330 acres on the south side of Woods River. (New River)

Page 87. Israel Christian to Aaron Lewis. 1000 pounds. Bond to make good the title to 80 acres of land.

Page 87. Robert Whitley to Hugh Barely. Conveys water right. February 17, 1773. Witnesses: Cloyd Adley, Paul Hall, John Hall.

Page 88. March 4, 1770. George Teater and Sarah his wife to Howard Heavin. 10 pounds. 85 acres on Crab Creek, a branch of the New River.
