ROLL OF COMPANY K, 8th TENNESSEE REGIMENT

Following is a copy of the roll of Company K, 8th Tennessee Regiment. My grandfather, Lon Houston Darwin, son of William Green and Mary (Burke) Darwin was a member of that company. He enlisted May 17, 1861 and served until injured in the battle of Atlanta, July 22, 1864. he was sent to a hospital in Griffin, Georgia; but they had to flee when the Federals were overtaking them. he was discharged from a hospital in Augusta, Georgia at the close of the war. he was broke and stranded and had to work his way bsck to Flynn's Lick in Jackson County, Tennessee.

Three of his brothers also served the Confederacy:

John Granville Darwin, 25th Tennessee Infantry, who died from the measless while in service.

William Harrison Darwin, 25th Tennessee Infantry, was captured in front of Petersburg, Virginia 17 June 1864 and was a prisoner until the end of the war.

George Chapman Darwin, 25th Tennessee Infantry, was taken prisoner 6 months before the end of the war:

This roll was sent to my Grandfather in 1916, after his brother William H. Darwin of Wickes, Arkansas had attended a Confederate reunion.
