

Mrs. Louisa Don Carlos

Funeral services for Mrs. Louisa Cooke Don Carlos, 75, former resident of Nashville, who died Tuesday at Lawrence, Kan., were held Friday at the cemetery in Lawrence. Mrs. Don Carlos was a noted writer. She was the daughter of the late Colonel Bolivar H. and Alice Kessel Cooke, and was a native of Louisville, Ky. She moved to Nashville with her parents at an early age and received part of her education here. She attended Ward-Belmont college while Nashville. After the death of her husband Harry E. Don Carlos, former federal judge, in 1933, she made a trip around the world and wrote of this trip in her book, The Hearth, 17 Eleventh Street. Her most recent writing is a novel. The Pride of the Prairie, on which she had done research on early Kansas history, for several vears. She is survived by three sisters, Mrs. T. G. Settle, formerly of Nashville, now of Arlington, Va., Mrs. Comer Sorrell, of White county, Tenn., and Mrs. Charles Mitchell, of Millbrook, Ala.
